

**HELPFUL HINTS REGARDING USE OF COURTROOM TECHNOLOGY**  
**(4/5/06)**

The Courtroom is equipped with technology that will allow parties to broadcast exhibits and other documents to opposing parties, witnesses and the Court from the display output on most laptop computers. Paper copies of exhibits may also be broadcast from a document projector located in the courtroom.

Parties may also broadcast video from laptop computer to monitors throughout the courtroom. However, at this time the courtroom is not equipped with speakers. Parties may bring their own speakers if they wish to broadcast from a laptop with sound. The courtroom is also equipped to display a VHS on a television monitor. The speakers on the television monitor may be utilized and no additional speakers are necessary.

The courtroom is equipped with wireless internet access (WiFi). Instructions for utilizing this technology are available outside the courtroom and on the Court's website.

Parties are strongly encouraged to utilize the technology available in the courtroom. If parties would be more comfortable testing the broadcast or other technology prior to the hearing or trial, please confer with the courtroom deputy—being mindful of the Court's schedule. The courtroom deputy will help parties test equipment if requested, but interruption of another proceeding is not permitted.
