
**ORDER ON MOTIONS TO QUASH SUBPOENAS FILED BY STANDARD & POOR'S,  
A DIVISION OF MCGRAW-HILL COMPANIES, INC., CURTIS MOULTON, AND  
DAVID BODEK (INSTRUMENT NO. 4067) AND BY MOODY'S INVESTORS  
SERVICE, INC. (INSTRUMENT NO. 4115)**

Non-parties Standard & Poor's, a division of McGraw-Hill Companies, Inc., Curtis Moulton, and David Bodek (Instrument No. 4067) and Moody's Investors Service, Inc. (Instrument No. 4115) have filed Motions to Quash the Subpoenas served by JPMorgan Chase & Co., JPMorgan Chase Bank, N.A., and J.P. Morgan Securities Inc. ("JPMC"). These subpoenas are for testimony and documents concerning issues fully briefed in the Motion to Compel filed by JPMC and ruled upon today. For the reasons set forth in the Court's order filed contemporaneously, it is hereby

ORDERED that Motion by Non-Parties Standard & Poor's, A division of the McGraw-Hill Companies, Inc., Curtis Moulton, and David Bodek to Quash Subpoenas served by Defendants JP Morgan Chase & Col, et al. (Instrument No. 4067) is GRANTED. It is further

ORDERED that Non-Party Moody's Investors Service, Inc.'s Motion to Quash Deposition Subpoena or in the Alternative for a Protective Order is GRANTED.
