ORDER

In order to clarify the equalization of the docket, it is necessary to amend Division of Work Order 92-14, in connection with the appointment of the Honorable Ewing Werlein, Jr., as a United States District Judge, Southern District of Texas, to sit in the Houston Division, the Clerk of the Court is ordered to establish a docket as follows:

Randomly assign civil cases equally from the dockets of United States District Judges Norman Black, Lynn Hughes, David Hittner, Kenneth Hoyt, Sun Lake, Melinda Harmon, John Rainey and Samuel Kent the number of cases required to equate the civil docket of Judge Werlein with that of the average number of pending civil cases per Judge in the Houston/Galveston Divisions as of May 1, 1992.

Of the cases identified for assignment to Judge Werlein, substitute any cases which involve the law firm of Vinson and Elkins.

Remove Chief Judge James DeAnda from the random draw of civil and criminal cases. Place Judge Werlein in the draw effective May 26, 1992, in line with the Amended Division of Work Order to be entered.
