ORDER

In order to clarify the equalization of the docket, it is necessary to amend Division of Work Order No. 92-16, in connection with the appointment of the Honorable Lee H. Rosenthal, as a United States District Judge, Southern District of Texas, to sit in the Houston Division, the Clerk of the Court is ordered to establish a docket as follows:

Randomly assign equally from the dockets of United States District Judges Norman Black, Lynn Hughes, David Hittner, Kenneth Hoyt, Sim Lake, Melinda Harmon, John Rainey and Samuel Kent the number of civil cases required to equate the civil docket of Judge Rosenthal with that of the average number of pending civil cases per Judge in the Houston/Galveston Divisions in accordance with the attached formula.

Of the cases transferred to Judge Rosenthal, exclude any cases which involve the law firm of Baker and Botts.

The Clerk is directed to place Judge Rosenthal in the random draw of civil and criminal cases effective July 15, 1992, in line with the Amended Division of Work Order to be entered.
