ORDER

In connection with the appointment of The Honorable Vanessa D. Gilmore as a United States District Judge, Southern District of Texas, to sit in the Houston Division, the Clerk of Court is ordered to establish a docket as follows:

Randomly assign from the dockets of United States District Judges Lynn Hughes, David Hittner, Kenneth Hoyt, Sim Lake, Melinda Harmon, John Rainey, Ewing Werlein, Jr. and Lee Rosenthal, the number of civil cases required to equate the civil docket of Judge Gilmore with that of the average number of pending civil cases per judge in the Houston Division in accordance with the attached formula.

The Clerk is directed to place Judge Gilmore in the random draw of civil and criminal cases effective June 20, 1994, in line with the Amended Division of Work Order to be entered.

STEP I

Determination of number of cases to be assigned to Judge Gilmore

3538 (Pending Cases 3/31/94) = Houston/Victoria case load (less Judge Black)

+ 9 Judges (All except Judge Black, plus Judge Gilmore)

393 Cases to be assigned to Judge Gilmore

STEP 2

Determination of composition of Judge Gilmore's docket

- (a) Transfer 95 Houston cases from Judge Rainey's Houston docket to compensate for current Victoria docket.
- (b) Allocate the remainder of Judge Gilmore's docket equally from all Houston judges, except Judge Black.

393 - 95 = 298 divided by 8 = 37 cases from each Houston judge (including Judge Rainey), except Judge Black
