SECOND AMENDED DIVISION OF WORK ORDER FOR CALENDAR YEAR 1994

- 4. Liaison Judge for attorney disciplinary proceedings at the Houston Division.
- 5. Liaison judge to the pro se law clerks.
- 6. Miscellaneous docket for September, 1994 at the Houston Division.

ITEM FIFTEEN: Judge Janis Jack

- 1. Retention of all cases presently on her docket.
- 2. 50% of all criminal cases filed at the Corpus Christi Division and the Victoria Division.
- 3. 50% of all civil cases filed at the Corpus Christi Division.

<u>ITEM SIXTEEN:</u> <u>Judge Vanessa D. Gilmore</u>

- 1. Retention of all cases presently on her docket.
- 2. 10.75% of all criminal cases filed at the Houston Division.
- 3. 10.75% of all civil cases filed at the Houston Division.
- 4. Miscellaneous docket for October, 1994 at the Houston Division.

ITEM SEVENTEEN: Judge Hugh Gibson (Senior)

- 1. Retention of all cases presently on his docket and those cases accepted from other members of the court.
- 2. All civil cases filed in the Galveston Division in which Judge Kent is disqualified or has chosen to recuse himself.

<u>ITEM EIGHTEEN: Miscellaneous Docket in Houston</u>

- 1. Applications for restraining orders, preliminary or temporary injunctions, and similar emergency matters are to be handled by the judge to whom the matter is assigned on its being filed. If that judge is not available and if the emergency requires prompt action, the matter will be ref erred to the judge with the miscellaneous docket.
- 2. The miscellaneous docket in the Houston Division consists of those matters that may arise prior to a civil action, an indictment, criminal information, or other proceeding being filed and assigned to a judge, including Naturalization Ceremonies. The judge with the miscellaneous docket receives motions,, grants immunity to a witness, rules on in forma pauperis applications in matters not

previously assigned to a judge, etc.

- 3. The judge handling the miscellaneous docket shall summon and empanel all grand and petit juries at the Houston Division. The judge will summon and have available for the use of the other judges at the Houston Division a petit jury weekly during the calendar year.
- The miscellaneous docket duties may be exchanged by consent, with notice to the clerk and the chief judge.

ITEM NINETEEN:

Hugh Gibson

General

- In cases in which a judge is disqualified or stands recused, the clerk shall at random assign the matter to another judge.
- 2. None of these arrangements deprives a judge of this district of jurisdiction of any matter, but it is made to expedite the disposition of cases. A judge may handle other matters for any other judge by consent.
- 3. Matters affecting a liaison assignment should be brought first to the attention of the liaison judge who may handle routine administrative matters. Any emergency questions involving court policies will be discussed with the chief judge, and may be resolved by the liaison judge and chief judge. All such emergency matters shall be reported to the full court in time for discussion at the next full court meeting.
- 4. The attorney admissions fund will be administered as provided in the Plan.
- 5. The chief judge will select the time and place of meetings of the court, three of which will be held annually. Special meetings of the court will be called by the chief judge as necessary. The judges in Houston will meet Tuesdays at noon and on call of the chief judge.
