# 18. Judge Hugh Gibson (Senior)

# <u>Miscellaneous Docket in Houston</u>

- A. Applications for restraining orders, preliminary or temporary injunctions, and similar emergency matters are to be handled by the judge to whom the matter is assigned when filed. If that judge is not available and if the emergency requires prompt action, the matter will be referred to the judge assigned the miscellaneous docket.
- B. The miscellaneous docket in the Houston Division consists of those matters that arise before a civil or criminal proceeding

is filed and assigned to a judge, such as naturalization ceremonies, grants of immunity to witnesses, and <u>in forma pauperis</u> applications.

- C. The miscellaneous docket judge shall summon and empanel all grand and petit juries in the Houston Division.
- D. The miscellaneous docket duties may be exchanged by consent with notice to the clerk and the chief judge.

#### **General**

- A. In cases in which a judge in the Houston Division is disqualified or stands recused, the clerk shall randomly assign the matter to another judge. The judges in the Brownsville, Corpus Christi, Laredo, and McAllen Divisions share recusals and disqualifications originating in those divisions. Where there are two resident judges, the case will first be reassigned to the other judge. The Victoria Division will share recusals with Houston and Galveston.
- B. Nothing in this order is to deprive a judge of jurisdiction in a matter, but is to expedite the disposition of cases. A judge may handle other matters for another judge by consent of both.
- C. Matters affecting a liaison assignment should be brought first to the attention of the liaison judge who may handle routine administrative matters. Emergency questions involving court policies will be discussed with the chief judge and may be resolved by the liaison judge and chief judge. All emergency matters will be reported to the Houston judges in time for discussion at the next judges' meeting and the full court shall be informed of the matter.
- D. The attorney admissions fund will be administered as provided in the Plan.
- E. The chief judge will select the time and place of meetings of the court, three of which will be held annually. Special meetings of the court will be called by the chief judge as necessary. The judges in Houston will meet Tuesdays at noon and on call of the chief judge.
