## **ORDER**

- By General Orders 2020-9 and 2020-16, the Bankruptcy Court for the Southern 1. District of Texas temporarily authorized the use of video conferencing and other means to satisfy the in-person meeting requirement under the fixed fee agreements in chapter 13 cases. These orders expired by their own terms on December 31, 2020.
- 2. Feedback from the bar and the availability of multiple inexpensive computer platforms have established that the use of video conferencing on a permanent basis is a benefit to both members of the bar and chapter 13 debtors. Accordingly, the Bankruptcy Court has unanimously voted to authorize the use of video conferencing on a permanent basis to satisfy the one hour in-person meeting requirement under the chapter 13 fixed fee agreements.
- 3. Modified versions of the chapter 13 fixed fee agreements are posted on the Court's website.
