

SPECIAL ORDER NO. M-2025-1

ORDER

In connection with the proposed reappointment of United States Magistrate Judge Juan Alanis for the Southern District of Texas serving in the McAllen Division, the Court appoints a Merit Selection Panel as required by § 6.03(b) of the Regulations of the Judicial Conference of the United States establishing procedures for such reappointments.

The Merit Selection Panel will be guided by the standards described in the pamphlet, "The Selection, Appointment, and Reappointment of United States Magistrate Judges," published in October 2016 by the Administrative Office of the United States Courts. The Clerk will make a copy available to each Panel member.

The Merit Selection Panel consists of the following persons:



Unsolicited contact with the panel members regarding this reappointment is discouraged by the Court.

The Clerk of Court has made a public announcement that Judge Alanis's current term of office is due to expire on April 29, 2026. The public was invited to comment on his proposed reappointment by August 29, 2025. The Merit Selection Panel will thereafter submit to this Court its recommendation as to whether Judge Alanis should be reappointed to another term as United States Magistrate Judge in the McAllen Division of the Southern District of Texas. The recommendation shall be filed no later than October 31, 2025. The Merit Selection Panel shall review the incumbent's performance in office as a magistrate judge. It should consider comments received from members of the bar and the public, and any other pertinent evidence as to Judge Alanis's character, judgment, legal ability, temperament, and commitment to equal justice under the law. An interview with the Southern District of Texas Magistrate Judge Committee and Judge Alanis is also generally considered to be useful to the Panel.

All Panel members are advised that the Regulations of the Judicial Conference of the United States Establishing Standards and Procedures for the Appointment and Reappointment of United States Magistrate Judges restrict merit selection panel members from being considered for a magistrate judge position one year from the application deadline for the position and the earlier of either (1) the date when the panel on which the former member served submitted its report to the Court, or (2) the date when the former member resigned from the panel, unless there is a waiver to the restriction by the Judicial Conference Committee on the Administration of the Magistrate Judges System granted on an individual case basis.
