

GENERAL ORDER NO. 2025-22

ORDER

The Court hereby adopts the Mandatory Conditions of Supervision, as approved by the Judicial Conference, for persons placed on Probation or Supervised Release as set forth in forms AO245B, 245C and 245D.

The Court further adopts the following Standard and Special Conditions of supervision that the Judge may apply to the supervised person at sentencing:

Standard Condition(s):

1. You must report to the probation office in the federal judicial district where you are authorized to reside within 72 hours of your release from imprisonment, unless the probation officer instructs you to report to a different probation office or within a different time frame.
2. After initially reporting to the probation office, you will receive instructions from the court or the probation officer about how and when you must report to the probation officer, and you must report to the probation officer as instructed.
3. You must not knowingly leave the federal judicial district where you are authorized to reside without first getting permission from the court or the probation officer.
4. You must answer truthfully the questions asked by your probation officer.

5. You must live at a place approved by the probation officer. If you plan to change where you live or anything about your living arrangements (such as the people you live with), you must notify the probation officer at least 10 days before the change. If notifying the probation officer in advance is not possible due to unanticipated circumstances, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours of becoming aware of a change or expected change.
6. You must allow the probation officer to visit you at any time at home or elsewhere, and you must permit the probation officer to take any items prohibited by the conditions of your supervision that he or she observes in plain view.
7. You must work full time (at least 30 hours per week) at a lawful type of employment, unless the probation officer excuses you from doing so. If you do not have full-time employment, you must try to find full-time employment, unless the probation officer excuses you from doing so. If you plan to change where you work or anything about your work (such as your position or your job responsibilities), you must notify the probation officer at least 10 days before the change. If notifying the probation officer at least 10 days in advance is not possible due to unanticipated circumstances, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours of becoming aware of a change or expected change.
8. You must not communicate or interact with someone you know is engaged in criminal activity. If you know someone has been convicted of a felony, you must not knowingly communicate or interact with that person without first getting the permission of the probation officer.
9. If you are arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours.

10. You must not own, possess, or have access to a firearm, ammunition, destructive device, or dangerous weapon (i.e., anything that was designed, or was modified for, the specific purpose of causing bodily injury or death to another person such as nunchakus or tasers).
11. You must not act or make any agreement with a law enforcement agency to act as a confidential human source or informant without first getting the permission of the court.
12. If the probation officer determines that you pose a risk to another person (including an organization), the probation officer may require you to notify the person about the risk and you must comply with that instruction. The probation officer may contact the person and confirm that you have notified the person about the risk.
13. You must follow the instructions of the probation officer related to the conditions of supervision.

Special Condition(s):

1. Support of Dependents: You must support his/her dependents. If ordered by the government, you must make child support payments or support a person caring for a child.
2. Debt Obligations: You must not incur new credit charges or open additional lines of credit without approval of the probation officer unless you are in compliance with the installment schedule of payment of restitution or fine.
3. Access to Financial Obligations: You must provide the probation officer access to any requested financial information.
4. Substance Abuse:
 - a. You must participate in an inpatient or outpatient substance-abuse treatment program and follow the rules and regulations of that program. The probation officer will supervise your participation in the program, including the provider, location,

modality, duration, and intensity. You must pay the costs of the program if financially able.

- b. You must participate in an inpatient or outpatient alcohol-abuse treatment program and follow the rules and regulations of that program. The probation officer will supervise your participation in the program, including the provider, location, modality, duration, and intensity. You must pay the costs of the program if financially able.
 - c. You may not possess any controlled substances without a valid prescription. If you do have a valid prescription, you must follow the instructions on the prescription.
 - d. You must submit to substance-abuse testing to determine if you have used a prohibited substance, and you must pay the costs of the testing if financially able. You may not attempt to obstruct or tamper with the testing methods.
 - e. You may not use or possess alcohol.
 - f. You may not knowingly purchase, possess, distribute, administer, or otherwise use any psychoactive substances, including synthetic marijuana or bath salts, that impair a person's physical or mental functioning, whether or not intended for human consumption, except as with the prior approval of the probation officer.
5. Mental Health: You must participate in a mental-health treatment program and follow the rules and regulations of that program. The probation officer, in consultation with the treatment provider, will supervise your participation in the program, including the provider, location, modality, duration, and intensity. You must pay the cost of the program if financially able.

6. Immigration Related Requirements: You must immediately report, continue to report, or surrender to U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement and follow all their instructions and reporting requirements until any deportation proceedings are completed. If you are ordered deported from the United States, you must remain outside the United States unless legally authorized to reenter. If you reenter the United States, you must report to the nearest probation office within 72 hours after you return.
7. Sex Offenses:
 - a. You must participate in a sex offender treatment program approved by the U.S. Probation Office.
 - b. The use of a computer or interactive computer services is limited.
 - c. You must submit to a search, at any time, with or without a warrant, and by any law enforcement officer or probation officer, of your person any property, house, residence, vehicle, papers, computer, or electronic communication or data storage devices or media, and effects upon reasonable suspicion concerning a violation of a condition of supervised release or unlawful conduct by you, or by any probation officer in the lawful discharge of the officer's supervision functions.
 - d. You must not communicate or otherwise interact with any victim of the offense, either directly or through someone else.
8. Unpaid Restitution, Fines, or Special Assessments: The defendant must notify the U.S. Probation Office of any material change in the defendant's economic circumstances that might affect the defendant's ability to pay restitution, fines, or special assessments.
9. Educational or Vocational Training: You must participate in a program to obtain a high school or equivalent diploma, vocational training, or skills training.

10. Victim Contact: You must not communicate or otherwise interact with any victim, either directly or through someone else.

11. Intermittent Confinement: You must serve a total of _____ days of intermittent confinement. The intermittent confinement shall be served for consecutive (weekends or days) at the facility beginning on (day), (date) at (time) and ending on (day), (date), no later than (time). You must follow the rules and regulations of the facility.

12. Location Monitoring: You will be monitored by the form of location monitoring technology indicated below for a period of X months, and you must follow the rules and regulations of the location monitoring program. 

_You are restricted to your residence at all times except for medical necessities and court appearances or other activities specifically approved by the court (Home Incarceration).

_You must comply with the following condition:
